

## Speakers: Rich & Joanne Hehn—on SSgt. Roy H. Little



Sargent Roy Little, a native of Cudahy, was lost in the North Sea on 12/31/44 in an incident known as the "Piggyback Flight" and "Breeding Dragonflies." Two planes became locked together while returning to England from a bombing mission over Hamburg. Rich Hehn, Roy Little's cousin, has done research on this incident along with meeting someone who witnessed the collision. Hear how several men survived this incredible event, once again showing the dedication of our military men. He was part of the 100th Bomb Group known as the "Bloody 100th" due to the high loss rate. Rich & Joanne brought some of Roy Little's items to an Open House last summer. They felt the Historical Society would honor and protect the memorabilia that includes medals, including a Purple Heart, some flier's scarves that are actually maps of Europe,

along with Roy Little's diary. All of the items will be on display on the 17th.

## Depot's Jukebox Back in Tune

The old juke box in the Depot was back in operation for the last open house of 2015 thanks to a fortunate meeting following the band concert last summer.

For most of the year, the old growler is loaded with 45 rpm records from the 1950s to early '60s. For the Christmas at the Depot event, I replace those with Christmas tunes from the same era. When I changed the records back in spring, however, I messed something up causing the same record to play over and over again.

A little bit of history: This 1951 Seeburg was the first juke box made to play 45 rpm records. It was donated to the Society several years ago by Cudahy resident John Sulik along with ample funds for its restoration. This juke, made in Chicago, had spent many years entertaining patrons in a bar that John's brother had owned in Cudahy on Squire

Ave. The box was lovingly restored to as-new condition by my son Jonathan in 2012.


Both my sons like to find and restore juke boxes as a hobby. While they have had many Wurlitzers, AMIs and Rock-Olas over the years, the Seeburg is Jon's least favorite to work on. Although he tried to fix what I broke, he was ready to call in someone else to look at it.

Then I met Christopher Hastreiter. He was one of the musicians at the concert who stopped by to tour the Depot after the event. He spent a lot of time looking at the Seeburg and I asked him if he knew anything about them. Turns out they are his favorite boxes and I think he said he even has one in his bedroom!

Christopher, who is a product engineer in controls and switchgear products of the Cooper

Power Systems division of Eaton in South Milwaukee, was the perfect person to get the Seeburg back in operation. He promised to come back with some tools and test equipment. He did, and had everything up and running in about 45 minutes. Many thanks to him for getting it "back in tune."


So this year I guess more care will be taken when it comes time to unload, load and reload the juke box.
